Teach your toddler about shapes and how things match with a home-made shape sorter.

## You'll need

An empty cardboard box with a lid – it doesn't matter what size, though a shoe box is a useful size and the cardboard is not too stiff to cut into.

- 1 Find your box, and decorate it with coloured paper or stickers, or use crayons to draw a pattern on it (your toddler can help you do this).
- ② Get together a few small toys or safe household objects. You might include a toy brick, a ball, a stiff envelope and a small doll or teddy.
- 3 Using the objects as a guide, cut out holes in the box lid that are big enough, and the right shape, to match the objects.
- 4 Your toddler has to 'post' the objects into the box, using the right holes. It doesn't matter if a smaller object goes into a bigger hole as well as its own hole, though the game will be more of a challenge if this isn't the case with every object or every hole.
- 5 Talk about the game as your toddler plays it. Tell him the ball is round, and it goes into the round hole; the envelope is very thin so it goes into the thin hole....and so on.
