



MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

This Sunday is the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In Mark's Gospel, we will hear how Jesus and his disciples went to his home town of Nazareth and began teaching in the synagogue. 
Sports Day

This programme is **free** to Islington residents who are aged between 4-16 years (up to 18 if they have special educational needs and disability (SEND)), enrolled in school and meet one of the following criteria:

- qualify for benefits-related Free School Meals (FSM)
- can be referred by a social worker, family support worker or other professional.

If you are not eligible, some activities are free for all.

To book activities, you need to register your child on their booking system. If you have already registered, you do not need to do this again.



Nursery: St Anthony & St Nicholas:






Year 1-St Francis



Year 2-St Teresa


Year 2-St John Paul


