

MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

Tomorrow, Saturday 29th June, is the Feast Day of Saints Peter and Paul who are also known as the 'rock' or 'pillars' on which the Church was built. Children in Key Stage 2 attended Mass in Church today where they learned more about this important Feast Day. The personal backgrounds and individual lives of these two saints were very different. Peter, who received this special name, meaning 'rock', from Jesus himself, was one of his first chosen disciples and was named by him as leader of the 12 Apostles. Paul never met Jesus in his time on earth. He only met Jesus after Jesus had risen. This took place on the road to Damascus, an event which changed Saul of Tarsus into Paul, Apostle to the Gentiles.



St Peter is the name of one of our classes so it is their feast day as well - St Peter Reception class where Miss Palmer is the teacher. Happy Feast Day St Peter.

At our Mass today we also remembered one of our past pupils, Leonardo Reid, who tragically passed away a year ago today. Leo's family were at our Mass and joined us back in school afterwards where a commemorative plaque was unveiled and blessed by Fr. Samuel. 
Sign Up Saturday!

- can be referred by a social worker, family support worker or other professional.


If you are not eligible, some activities are free for all.





EYES Phase News

Nursery: St Anthony & St Nicholas:

This week in St Anthony & St Nicholas we are really getting into our minibeast topic. The children enjoy going on minibeast hunts in the garden and comparing their finds. They are creating a bug hotel in a shaded part of the garden and hope it will attract some more unusual minibeasts, they are doing observational drawings of minibeasts using pastels and they are finding different resources that they can use to create minibeasts. Here are two rather large spiders made from Knex.



Reception: St Jude & St Peter:

Reception have been observing the life-cycle of caterpillars over the last few weeks! We have grown them from tiny caterpillars, to big fat caterpillars, to chrysalises to beautiful butterflies. We have fed them sugar water and cut-up bits of orange and apple and have observed them feeding through their long tongues. On Wednesday, we let our butterflies go by our pond so they could get some fresh air and find a new habitat!



KS1 Phase News

Year 1-St Brigid

During our DT lesson, we had a great time following a design to create our own well. We carefully selected appropriate materials and tools for our product.



Year 1-St Francis

This week, St Francis class have been exploring the text Meerkat Mail. We are imagining Sonny the Meerkat's next great adventure... London! We designed postcards he would send back to his family in the Kalahari Desert. Here is Ayanna's fantastic example.

Year 2-St Teresa

In DT, we have made shortbread! In our topic lessons we have been learning about countries in the UK and so we decided to bake some shortbread whilst we were learning about Scotland. We did mixing, rolling and cutting to make delicious biscuits!



Year 2-St John Paul

In RE we read the story 'Maybe God is Like That Too' and this time we thought about where we have experienced, seen or felt God in our own lives. Then, we were each given a different fruit of the spirit and had to pick a time when we had felt it so that we could create our own version of the story! We put all of our pages together and made our very own book for our prayer table that we can take with us to Year 3.

LKS2 Phase News

In St Martin de Porres, we have been looking at the functional and aesthetic properties of a cable car. Last lesson we created labelled diagram plans of the pulley system which allow the cable cars to move. We will then use these plans to help us create our own pulley systems.




This week, in St Bernadette, we spent our last RE lesson looking for God in our classroom and in our lives. We spent time discussing all the wonderful things we do for each other and we linked our actions to our faith.

Last Friday, both Y4 classes went on their second trip to the zoo. We were hoping to see all the things we didn't have time for during our last visit! However, we also went back to see some of our favourites from last time. While we were there, we saw the gorillas and their babies as well as the new lion cubs (which were very sleepy!). It was also World Giraffe Day so we listened to the giraffe talk at their enclosure and got to ask some questions about being a zookeeper. Lots of us also got lollies that turned our tongues blue; just like a giraffe! This time, we chose to move round in smaller groups so we saw different things. If you want to know about tiny giants, meerkats, the animals of the farmyard or the penguins, ask one of year 4 when you next see them!



UKS2 Phase News

This week, in DT, Year 5 Saint Faustina have been constructing boats. We have spent one week coming up with independent designs and creating a Success Criteria. The following week, we then split off into groups to collaborate on designs. We have collected and used recycled materials to help us build our boats. We look forward to putting them to the test over the new few weeks!



This week, Year 5 Saint Benedict have started to write out our analytical essay answering the question 'What can we learn from other generations?'. This links to our class text 'Alte Zachen'. We wrote our introductions on Monday and included modal verbs and rhetorical questions. Well done, Year 5!

This week, in PHSE, Year 6 have been learning about bleed kits. In the event of an accident or emergency, bleed kits are essential to prevent further blood loss and help save someone's life! We looked at the location of some of the kits around Islington, how to access them and what was inside. We also watched a video tutorial to show us how to use the items for different kinds of injuries. As well as this, we have started to rehearse our Leavers' Assembly! We are very much looking forward to showing you what we have been practising in a few weeks time!
