






MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

This Sunday is the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In Mark's Gospel we will learn about when a tiny little mustard seed is planted it grows into a big bush with branches big enough for all the birds to come and sit in. In the children's liturgy, we are asked to think a bit more about what Jesus was trying to say with this story. We will learn that God shows us that the littlest actions can have huge results and that the smallest of people can do great things. We ask God to inspire us to play our part in making the world a fairer place for everyone.



We had a wonderful day last Saturday at the FOSH Summer Fair. This was our second post-pandemic Summer Fair since 2019 and it was great to see everyone who attended have a fantastic day. The booking window opens next Tuesday at 6pm.




Teddy Bears' Picnic Lunch

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps and when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord, the land produces: first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because harvest time has come." Then Jesus said, "Here is another example of what the kingdom of God is like. It is like a mustard seed which is the smallest of all the seeds; yet, once it is planted in the ground, it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade." Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.





EYFS Phase News


Nursery: St Anthony & St Nicholas:




Reception: St Jude & St Peter:


LKS2 Phase News

In St Martin de Porres this week, we have been learning how to solve equations using short division. This was quite tricky for some of us, as it was our first time practicing this method this year. Luckily, there were lots of children in our class willing to share their knowledge to help us all become more confident.



This week, in St Bernadette, we have started drafting a narrative based on the book, 'Cinderella of the Nile'. This week in St Catherine, we have been studying Islam. We studied the various ways that Muslims look after their holy text, the Qur'an and designed a special cover for it.



We have been creating powerful descriptive sentences about one of the main characters - Bubbe Rosa. We have also been practising our inference skills so that we can better understand the character and her history to aid us in our writing outcomes.


