

MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

Today, Friday 7th June 2024, is our School Feast Day, The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. We celebrated and marked this important occasion in school with our Key Stage 2 classes (Years 3-6) attending Mass in our Parish Church at 10:00 am. We also made a visual representation of the Lord's Prayer which all classes contributed to. It is a day when we remember what our school and community represents and stands for. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French Roman Catholic Visitation nun and mystic, is greatly recognized for her devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and it is after her our annexe is named - St Margaret Mary Annexe (SMMA). When our Year 5 and 6 children enter SMMA every day they see a picture of St. Margaret Mary, which reminds them of our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.



Next week, on Thursday 13th June, it will be the Feast Day of one of our class saints, St Anthony. St Anthony (of Padua) is the name of one of our Nursery classes whose teacher is Mrs. O'Mahoney. He, Fernando Martins de Bulhões, was born in Lisbon, Portugal, in 1195 and raised by a wealthy family. He died, aged 35, in Padua in Italy on 13th June 1231. This is why he is known and often referred to as St Anthony of Padua. He was canonised the following year in 1232 and has a Basilica in Padua named after him. Next to St. Joseph and the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Anthony of Padua is the saint who is most often depicted in statues or images holding the Child Jesus.



Thank you for your recent responses to our school uniform survey. Lots of you replied which was really helpful. 



Sacred Heart Feast Day





TOGETHER TIME

1 Enjoy reading this Sunday's Gospel

Jesus went back home with his disciples, and such a large crowd had gathered that they did not even have chance to eat. When Jesus' family heard what he was doing, they set out to take him away with them, convinced he was out of his mind. Some teachers of the law came down from Jerusalem and were disapproving and complaining about him. They falsely and foolishly claimed that Jesus' powers were not from God, but that he was using evil powers to heal people. Then Jesus' concerned mother and brothers arrived outside and sent in a message asking for him to come out to them. A crowd was sitting round Jesus at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' Jesus replied, 'Who is my mother and who are my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting around him, he said, 'These people are also my mother and my brothers and sisters. Anyone who does the will of God is my brother or sister or mother.'

2 Wednesday's Word **FAMILY** 😊

"When Jesus chose and called the Apostles, He did not think of them as separate from one another, each one on his own, but together, because they were to stay with Him, united, like a single family." Pope Francis

What did Jesus say we must do to be part of his family? In the Gospel we hear Jesus saying how our openness and obedience to God is a sign that we belong to his family. Ask your child what the word 'family' means to them. What does it mean to belong to a family? Ask them what they like best about their family. Tell your child what you like best about the family.

"All God's children, of every people and language, are invited and called to be part of this great family, as brothers and sisters and sons and daughters of the one Father in heaven." Pope Francis

Jesus taught us that we are all children of God and we should live as brothers and sisters to each other. We show that we are part of Jesus' family by listening to his teaching and trying our best to follow it - by obeying God's will for our lives. Jesus was filled with love because of his closeness and obedience to God. Our families are filled with love too when we stay close to God. Each of you choose one way to bring more of God's love into your family this week. How can you show that same love to someone who is not in your immediate family?





Bigger plants don't always have bigger leaves. For example a dandelion has bigger leaves than a alder tree





Year 1-St Francis




UKS2 Phase News

This week, in DT, Year 5 Saint Faustina began drawing their boats. We identified the different materials that have been used in boats and came up with a success criteria. Saint Faustina will be working in groups and using recycled materials to manufacture our boats. Well done to Steven who did three brilliant designs!



In Science this week, Year 5 St. Benedict conducted an investigation to explore how a solution is made. They worked in groups and led their own experiments. One group had different containers, one had different amounts of water, one group had different temperatures and the final group had different types of sugar. Ask them what they observed in their experiments!

This week, Year 6 went to the 'Ben Kinsella Exhibition' in Finsbury Library. We started our session by looking at a comic story where the comic's main character had chosen to carry a knife to protect himself after experiencing bullying. We discussed what he should have done differently and why the choices he had made were not safe. We also went into 'Ben's Room' which taught us about Ben's life and watched an emotional documentary of how a series of negative choices left the Kinsella family, Ben's friends and a whole community, totally devastated. We will learn more about what happened to Ben and his family as we further explore our knife crime unit in PHSE.

OPEN EVENING – TUESDAY 25TH JUNE 2024

The Open Evening for Secondary Transfer admission to St Michael's, will be held on Tuesday 25th June 2024. Guided tours will be held between 5pm and 7pm. Mr Stimpson, Headteacher, will make a short presentation at 5pm and 7pm in The Sports Hall. You can attend the presentation before or after your tour, however, **all tours must be finished before the 7pm presentation.**

There are 128 places in each year and we are historically heavily oversubscribed. The following criteria will be used when pupils are selected for entry to the School.

1. Catholic girls :
 - from a Practising Catholic family
 - who have made their First Holy Communion in the Catholic Church

Girls who are registered as Pupil Premium with their primary school and are ranked amongst the top 200 places in the entrance test will be given priority for a maximum of 32 places, as long as they have met the Catholicity criteria and confirmation of their status has been provided by the application deadline.

The online application form is now open and can be found on the School's website <https://www.st-michaels.barnet.sch.uk/home/admissions/admissions-2025-26/>. It must be submitted by no later than **4pm on Tuesday 2nd July 2024**. Therefore it is imperative that you arrange to make an appointment with your Parish Priest to have your Certificate of Catholic Practice completed in sufficient time to meet the deadline.
