All children return to school on Monday, 15th April 2024.





# MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

It has been a very busy term with lots going on at school. In recent weeks, the children have been really busy preparing for Easter. Many of them have told me how difficult it is to keep their Lenten promises but how they are determined to do it. Our Lenten journey began during half term on Ash Wednesday (14th February). This half term the children's R.E. Topic is 'Lent to Easter' so they have been learning about this important time in their R.E. lessons. We are also supporting the Catholic Children's Society's Lenten Appeal and the important work they do. Holy Week is this week. Holy Thursday is today, 30th March, which is the beginning of The Easter Triduum - the name for the liturgical season that concludes Lent and introduces us to the joy of the Easter season. Starting with the Mass of the Lord's Supper that evening, continuing through the Good Friday service and Holy Saturday, this time marks the most significant events of Holy Week. This morning, Miss Skinner's class, Year 5 St Benedict, led our Easter assembly. Our children are welcome to attend our Parish Church's service tomorrow, Good Friday (29th March), at 11:00am, to learn about the Stations of the Cross.



It was lovely to welcome parents/carers into school this week for our Easter activities. The children loved having their parents/carers there to see and/or help with their Easter bonnets. It was lovely also to see some of you at our Easter egg competition display. FOSH were very busy this week too helping the Easter Bunny deliver goodies to every class and providing the present at these events. Thank you to everyone who supported FOSH's cake sale on Tuesday after school; despite the rain there was, as always, an excellent turnout. Photos of the activities and events are included in the newsletter. A BIG thank you to FOSH for their hard work and dedication again this term.



Today the school was a sea of purple as the children came to school in their own clothes in support of raising funds for the Catholic Children's Society. # EASTER BUNNY VISIT



**Good News for Families**

**1 Enjoy reading the Gospel**

Before sunrise on Sunday morning, Mary Magdalene went to Jesus' tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the entrance and that the tomb was empty. Mary ran to Peter and another disciple (John) and said, "Someone has taken the Lord out of the tomb and we don't know where they have put him." The disciples ran together to the tomb. But John, running faster than Peter, arrived first and looked into the tomb but did not go in. Peter, however, went into the tomb and he saw Jesus' linen burial cloths lying on the ground. He also saw the cloth that had been over Jesus' head; this was rolled up in a place by itself. Then John also went into the tomb; he saw and he believed. Until this moment they had failed to understand that Jesus must rise from the dead.

**2 "Let us prepare to celebrate Easter in the joy of God! Christ is risen! Christ is alive!" Pope Francis**

Why wasn't Jesus in the tomb? As a family, look at the pictures on the front cover of this booklet. What do they remind you of or make you think about? This week is Holy Week and this coming Sunday is Easter Sunday. This is the day when the Church throughout the world especially remembers and celebrates the resurrection of Jesus - his rising in glory. Ask your child what they have been learning at school about Easter Sunday. It may help your child if you tell them something else that you know, or have experienced, about Easter.

**3** Easter Sunday is the greatest day in the Church's calendar. This day reminds us that Jesus, the Son of God, offers each one of us a share in his everlasting life and eternal happiness. All are warmly invited to come and join with the Church community this Sunday and celebrate the hope that Jesus' resurrection brings to our lives. **1 Enjoy reading the Gospel**

The disciples were gathered in a room. They had locked the doors because they were afraid of the people who had crucified Jesus. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" He showed them the wounds in his hands and his side. Thomas, one of the disciples, was not there when Jesus came and he refused to believe what had happened. One week later they were in the room again and, this time, Thomas was also there. Jesus came and stood among them again and said to Thomas, "Here, touch the marks on my hands and feel the wound in my side. Doubt no longer, but believe." Thomas replied, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "You believe because you have seen me. Blessed are those who have not seen me and yet believe!"

**2 "Jesus is always ready to encourage and support us." Pope Francis**

After Jesus had died, the disciples were afraid that the people who had crucified him would now be looking for them too. Jesus' resurrection and miraculous appearance would have encouraged the disciples. When we listen to Jesus, we are filled with words of encouragement. Ask your child what the word 'encourage' means to them. Who encourages them and keeps them going when they find things difficult? How does it feel to be encouraged? Has your child ever encouraged anyone? What did they do?

**3** There are times when we all need encouraging: that is, to be inspired with courage and to have our hope renewed, especially when we are afraid or going through difficult times. Do you know anyone who may need your encouragement? Each of you choose a way to encourage someone during this Easter season. Perhaps you can: offer words of support; let someone know when they are doing something well; tell someone about the good news of Jesus' resurrection; give someone a helping hand if they are struggling. What else could you do?

Dear Lord Jesus, thank you for coming to strengthen and encourage us. Help us to be more like you - to be an encouragement to those around us. Amen.



## **Easter Holiday Camp @ Blessed Sacrament School**

Dear Parents,

I am delighted to announce that a multi-activity camp will be running during the upcoming Easter holidays from Tuesday 2nd April to Friday 5th April. The camp will run from 9.30 am to 2 pm each day, offering an exciting range of activities for your child to enjoy.

*-Be referred by a social worker, family support worker or other professional.*

If you meet the eligibility requirements for a free place, we kindly ask you to register your child/ren and book a place on the camp by clicking on the following link and selecting Sommer Camps:


