






MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

This Sunday Friday 17th March, is St. Patrick's Day. St. Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland. Did you know that children have a day off school in Ireland for St. Patrick's Day, it is a national Holiday. St. Patrick brought Christianity to Ireland and it is also believed that he banished snakes from the country. St. Patrick's Day is celebrated by people all over the world and we will be celebrating too with a special Irish themed dinner on Monday. Did you know that St Patrick is also the patron saint of Nigeria?



Next week, as part of their RE lessons, the children will be visiting our Parish Church to pray the Stations of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross is a form of prayer used traditionally in Lent. Each of the 14 Stations retells part of Jesus' Passion (his suffering and death) through images and words. These Stations of the Cross introduce children to Jesus' Passion, breaking it down into stages that they can reflect upon and remember. The Stations are more than the retelling of a story: they are a prayerful participation in the event that lies at the heart of Christianity - Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. Why not ask your children about their visit to the Church between now and the end of term.

Update for parents/carers- Work on Geary Street starting Monday 18th March 2024

Dear parents/carers,

Following on from previous communication about the upcoming work on Geary Street.....

Attached is a letter that was sent to all residents yesterday in connection with the work taking place on Geary Street next Monday 18th March for up to two weeks (until the end of term).

Please note that Geary Street will be closed to vehicles from Monday 18th March for at least one week and possibly until the end of term, Thursday 28th March.

Although pedestrian access will be maintained on Geary Street please be mindful of the works taking place when bringing your children to school in the morning and when collecting them at the end of the day.

When pupils need to go between the main building and SMMA we will be taking them the long way round during the duration of these works.

Apologies in advance for this inconvenience and please be assured that we have worked closely with Islington Council on ensuring all appropriate safety measures are put in place.. I'm sure you will agree that the improvements to Geary Street will be beneficial to our children, families and staff.

Dear resident,

Geary Street – works beginning on proposed footway widening and pavement improvements outside Sacred Heart Primary School

In line with the council's ambition for a greener and healthier Islington, we are writing to notify you of upcoming works to introduce footway widening and pavement improvements to the environment on Geary Street outside Sacred Heart Primary School.

We recently implemented a new traffic restriction and improvements to the environment on Georges Road as part of the Sacred Heart School Street project. We have been engaging with the local community since 2022 and held a consultation for the Sacred Heart School Street in July 2023 where concern was expressed over the narrow footway on Geary Street outside the school gate. We advertised the workshops through posters in the area and distributed flyers to local residents, as well as the school community. Separate workshops were also held with school pupils.

We wrote to local residents by letter again in December 2023 to notify you of the proposed changes to the carriageway through a Traffic Management Order, replacing the 'School Keep Clear' road markings with new double yellow lines. The consultation period ended on Friday 5 January and the decision has been taken to implement the proposed improvements to the footpath.


Figure 1: Improvements to Geary Street

The final proposals for Geary Street can be seen in Figure 1 below. Improvements include footway widening outside the school's secondary gate on Geary Street, raising of the carriageway outside the school to encourage lower vehicle speeds, new tactile paving for people crossing the street and two new trees.

Works to implement the improvements

We have now finalised the schedule of works to construct the scheme. The construction will be start on Geary Street from Monday, 18 March 2024. This could take up to two weeks in total to complete, barring any unforeseen circumstances.

Geary Street

Geary Street will be closed to vehicles throughout the works and only open for access only for one week. Pedestrian access on Geary Street will be maintained for the duration of works. All parking bays on Geary Street (9 bays) will be suspended for the duration of the works to enable contractors to work safely (see Figure 1 below which shows the suspended bays).





Whoever serves me, must follow me; wherever I am, my servant will be there too, if anyone serves me, my Father will honour them. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all people to myself." By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

"Let us ask for the grace to follow Jesus faithfully, not in words but in deeds." *Pope Francis*

We can follow Jesus in the simple things we do in our lives every day, and make life better for all the family and everyone around us. In this coming week, how can we follow Jesus, even in little ways? Perhaps you can be a good listener if someone is sad and wants to share their problems with you; find regular time to pray for others; be kind and generous; go out of your way to support anyone who needs your help.



Year 1-St Brigid


In our Maths lesson we have been learning about money. We talked about money and how it's important to know the value of things we buy. We learned that we need to choose the right coin when we pay for things.


Year 2-St Teresa and St John Paul



LKS2 Phase News

In St Martin de Porres we have been creating poems in our Writing lessons. Through our poems we imagined what anger would be like if it was an animal. We used an ABCB rhyming structure and repetition of line A to create rhythm. The children came up with some fantastic ideas which made them entertaining to read.



In St Bernadette, we have been looking at Fractions. We worked in pairs to find equivalent fractions using a fraction wall. We also began to notice that the denominators would be multiples of the smallest fraction. For example, $2/8$ is equivalent to $1/4$ and 8 is a multiple of 4.



This week Sacred Heart had a visit from Three, the telecommunications company. We had an assembly with Y5 and Y6 and then a workshop with Alan in our classroom. Alan helped us to continue building our awareness of potential dangers on the internet by highlighting some of the problems we may have to face during our own internet use. Then we were asked to make a comic strip all about staying safe in this digital age using characters from our own class! Thank you Three for the workshop, it was a great way to remind ourselves to stay safe, stay aware and stay online.



In PE this half term, St Catherine's class have been looking at handball. So far, we have perfected our jump shot, ensuring the ball leaves our hands in mid air, and we have practised pulling the ball close to our body with one hand- this helps us protect the ball from the opposing team. We've picked up these skills quickly and have been able to use them in some small games.

UKS2 Phase News

This week, in RE, Year 5 Saint Faustina retold the story of the death of Jesus. Some of us did comic strips, others did diary entries and some wrote newspaper reports and pretended to be journalists. We were all really engaged with the task and were able to get across the sad emotions of the people in the story.



Over the last few weeks, Year 5 Saint Benedict have been learning about decimals, percentages and fractions. This week, we have been learning how they all connect together and how to recognise percentages as fractions and decimals. Keep up the hard work year 5!

This week, in Art, Year 6 Saint Maximilian have been creating water colour washes as a background for our final pieces. We learnt about contrasting colours and linked this back to our mood board on the environment before creating our backing. We will then use old/ recycled papers to make trees and collage them on top of our background.



This week, Year 6 Saint Josephine class took part in a 'Discovery' workshop. We learnt about the importance of staying safe online and how to use a movie app. Using our learning, we role-played being news presenters and filmed our very own versions of Newsround to inform the public of the importance of staying safe online.


