MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

This Sunday is the third Sunday in Ordinary Time and in Mark's Gospel we will learn about the time Jesus went to Galilee after John's arrest, preaching God's imminent kingdom and urging repentance and belief in His message. By the Sea of Galilee, He called Simon and Andrew, fishermen, to follow Him and become 'fishers of men.' They promptly did. Next, Jesus summoned James and John, who also instantly left their father and work to follow Him, illustrating the compelling nature of Jesus' call and message. These disciples followed Jesus. Jesus went around the whole of Galilee teaching in synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people. We know the importance of having a strong community, something we experience at our school. Indeed one of our FIVE KEYS, **Community Unity**, shows how important this is to us.



We have been informed by Islington Council's people-friendly streets team, as part of the School Streets programme, how plans are progressing for a build-out on Geary Street to address concerns raised over the consultation and engagements held this time last year. They are proposing to introduce improvements to the footpath on Geary Street including:

- Extending footway to create more space outside of the school gate on Geary Street for people walking and parents gathering
- Raising the carriageway outside the school gate to encourage vehicles to slow their speed
- Two new trees to provide new greenery
- New tactile paving to support people crossing the street.

On the next two pages is a letter which was distributed to local residents before Christmas which includes an illustration of the proposed improvements. This includes a drawing outlining the improvements. On the page after that is a more detailed version of this drawing for your information.



The construction is scheduled to commence later this term and we will continue to liaise with officers from Islington Council about practical elements of these works. I will of course keep you updated on this.

This week the Met Office extended their cold weather warning, they upgraded it to amber which remains in place until today 19th January. The weather warnings go from green-yellow-amber-red. Please make sure your child continues to wrap up warm every day coming to school as they spend time outside every day at playtime and lunchtime.

Pavement improvements on Geary Street – proposed footway widening

In line with the council's ambition for a greener and healthier Islington, we are writing to notify you of proposals to improve the pavement and introduce additional greening on Geary Street outside Sacred Heart Primary School.

We recently implemented a new traffic restriction and improvements to the environment on Georges Road as part of the Sacred Heart School Street project. As part of the consultation for the Sacred Heart School Street, held in January 2023, people expressed concern over the narrow footway on Geary Street outside the school gate.

To address these concerns, we are proposing to introduce improvements to the footpath on Geary Street including:

- Extending footway to create more space outside of the school gate on Geary Street for people walking and parents gathering
- Raising the carriageway outside the school gate to encourage vehicles to slow their speed
- Two new trees to provide new greenery
- New tactile paving to support people crossing the street

The improvements will complement the existing greening outside the school on Georges Road and help create more space for people walking, wheeling and cycling on Geary Street. Larger vehicles such as emergency services, refuse collection and deliveries will still be able to access the street.

You can see a diagram of the improvements on the next page (Figure 1).

In order to implement these improvements and widen the footway on Geary Street, we will be removing the 'School Keep Clear' road markings and replacing these with new double yellow lines to continue to prevent vehicles stopping directly outside the school gate and allow traffic to flow on Geary Street.

We're proposing to implement the improvements on a permanent basis from February 2024. To change the 'School Keep Clear' road markings to new double yellow lines, we will be implementing a new Traffic Management Order (TMO), which is subject to a statutory consultation.


We will contact the local community in the coming weeks with further information on the final designs for the project as well as an update on the implementation timeline and works programme.



The children will return to school on Tuesday 20th February.






One child per class is awarded a VIP certificate in our celebration assemblies. They also get lunch on a specially decorated table with table service!

He called them at once and, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the men he employed, they went after him.



EYFS Phase News



Nursery: St Anthony & St Nicholas:



This week we have been re-enacting the story of "Farmer Duck". Here the children playing the part of the cow, the sheep and a hen. They are tipping the lazy farmer out of his bed. We talked about the kindness shown by the animals to the tired and weary duck.

This week, we had a visit from a dental nurse. She was so impressed by the knowledge that we had already about how to keep our teeth healthy. KSI Phase News

In Maths, St Francis class have been finding one more and less than a number using Dienes. We have practised a lot and even recorded these as addition and subtraction calculations in our books.




In St Brigid this week we have had some fun in our Science lessons. We sorted objects made of different materials into hoops based on their properties.


In St Bernadette's, we have begun our new Science Topic: 'Rocks'.



UKS2 Phase News

This week, Year 5 Saint Faustina have learnt about using momentum to help roll over our shoulder and backwards in PE. We learnt about the rock and roll technique, using our legs to get into the correct position and some of us were able to perform a shoulder/back roll from sitting to standing. The rolls learnt this week, will eventually be used in a sequence that we will perform to the rest of the class.



In Art, Year 5 Saint Benedict have been looking at Viking invaders (linked with our History and English topic/book). We have been practising different sketching techniques and then used them to make an image more authentic. We have practised squiggle, linear and cross-hatching sketching techniques and more! Well done year 5!

In Year 6 Saint Maximilian, we have been studying the text 'Macbeth'. In English, we have written a setting description to describe the Scottish heath (where the story is set) and have written dialogue between Macbeth and the witches. Well done for using inverted commas so accurately!



In Year 6 Saint Josephine, we have been learning about the Old Testament in R.E. We have learnt about the Israelite couple, Abraham and Sarah, and that they travelled from Canaan to Egypt to fulfill God's wishes. Next, we are going to learn about Moses and how he saved the Israelites from the Pharaoh.
