



# MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE







Dear Parents and Carers,


This Sunday is the last in the Church's year. It is the day we celebrate the feast of Christ the King.

Each of you speak about a kind person: at school, at work, or in the community. How do they show their kindness? Who has been especially kind to you? Have you done anything especially kind recently?

**3 Loving God & Each Other**

"How marvellous it would be if, at the end of the day, each one of us could say: 'Today I have performed an act of charity towards others!'" Pope Francis

We learn to be kind by receiving kindness - and our homes are great places to learn: families can be schools of kindness. In this coming week, in what ways can we show kindness to each other or to those who really need help? Perhaps we can: be more helpful around the house; share more and donate to a local food bank; as a family, show compassion through visiting or sending a card to someone who is lonely, sick or housebound; support a Charity that helps the homeless.

In our RE lesson, we learned all about Advent Wreaths! We discussed how they represent God's everlasting love, which is why wreaths are in a circle.




## Year 1-St Francis




# UKS2 Phase News
