

MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

This Sunday 22nd October is the Feast Day of one of our class saints, St John Paul II, which is the name of one of our Year 2 class whose teacher is Miss James. Pope John Paul II was born as Karol Józef Wojtyła in 1920 in a town called Wadowice in Poland. He was Pope for 27 years from 1978 until his death in 2005. He improved the Catholic Church's relations with other faiths including Judaism, Islam and Eastern Orthodox Churches. As Pope he visited 129 countries and came to this country in 1982. He really enjoyed football and his favourite position was a goalkeeper. He was a truly inspirational figure and we are so proud to have one of our classes named after him.



During half term, on Saturday 28th October, it is the Feast Day of another of our class saints, St Jude. St Jude is the name of one of our Reception classes whose teacher is Miss Barker. St Jude is often known as being the patron saint of lost causes and is also a symbol of choosing faith when all seems lost. St Jude was one of the 12 Apostles and was born in the 1st century AD in Galilee.

Happy Feast Day to both of these classes.

We are looking forward to welcoming you into school for parents/teachers Meetings after half term on Tuesday 31st October and Thursday 2nd November. These meetings with your child's teacher are an opportunity for you to find out what they have been learning in school and how they are getting on with all aspects of their learning and development.

A big thank you to our classes who have led assemblies for their parents/carers this term. Today, we learned a lot about Roman Rule from Year 4 St Elizabeth. In the previous two weeks we learned about The Rosary with Year 5 St Faustina and The Great War with Year 6 St Josephine. 

EYFS Phase News



Nursery: St Anthony & St Nicholas:

This week we have continued to explore our autumn topic and created a range of artwork. We had great fun dipping conkers in paint and then getting them to make tracks on paper by rolling and bouncing them across the paper.

In RE we have started exploring the story of 'Noah and the Flood'. We painted cardboard boxes and stuck them together to make an Ark and put it in our Story Corner.



Reception: St Peter:

This week Reception had a visit to the church on Thursday to celebrate the end of their 'In the Beginning' topic in RE.

In preparation for our visit we spoke about welcoming people and babies into the church through Baptism. We all took turns role playing as the priest and baptising the baby.

When we went to the church we looked around respectfully and carefully for the font Father Cideon uses at baptism in church!

Reception: St Jude:

This week, Reception have been finishing off their child-initiated 'Space' topic! We had great fun learning facts about our solar system! We even had our own floating blow-up solar system hanging up in class. We used our excellent phonics skills to label the names of the planets too!

We sent a photo of our solar system to all of the staff in the school and some were so impressed that they came to see it for themselves, including Mr. Fletcher & Mrs. Rodney!



KS1 Phase News

Year 1-St Brigid

In RE this week, we discussed the importance of welcoming people. We learned that the Catholic Church welcomes people through baptism - the Sacrament of initiation.



Year 2-St Teresa

In Art, we looked at what printing was and how different prints are created. We discovered the famous pop artist Andy Warhol and looked at how he created repeated screen prints. Then, we experimented with different print methods using a variety of materials, such as sponges and poly boards. Next week, we will apply these techniques to create repeated prints of our own!

Year 1-St Francis

St Francis class have been busy using their art and science skills to create sketches of leaves. Using magnifying glasses, we observed the different colours and used coloured pencils to recreate these. We were surprised to find red and purple autumn leaves!



Year 2-St John Paul

Year 2 have been learning about the history of the Church and how mass has changed over the years. In our lesson this week we looked at how people become members of the Church through baptism. To support our understanding of the Baptismal ceremony, we watched a video and then acted it out in our groups!





LKS2 Phase News

This week, in St Martin de Porres, we visited Caledonian Park where we took part in a workshop to help us better understand the human impact on climate change and environmental issues. We also explored the impact that this is having on animals since these issues are effecting their habitats. We felt quite empowered during the session to adopt better habits and discussed making small changes, such as buying loose fruit and vegetables and where we could bring our own reusable packaging instead of buying them already packaged.



This week, in St Bernadette, we have been exploring magnets within our Science lessons. We decided to explore our school playground and investigate which items were magnetic and which items were not magnetic. Not only was it a lot of fun but it was also very informative. We found out lots of items we thought would be magnetic actually weren't. We then took our results and created a table back in class. We are looking forward to continuing our lessons on magnets after half term!


This week, Y4 St Catherine have been using their story telling skills to retell 'The Meeting' in Roald Dahl's The Witches. We have been working on using metaphors- such as 'her voice was a tornado'- to add description and using inverted commas to correctly punctuate speech. The class have really managed to put themselves in the boy from the story's shoes and capture his utter terror at being trapped in a room with hundreds of witches.



This week, Y4 - St Elizabeth, have been hard at work for their class assembly, which is all about the Romans. We've learnt our lines, we know the songs and we've been making our props! We had to do shields for the Romans and the Celts, then a selection of other weapons. Take a look at what we've been doing!

UKS2 Phase News

Year 5 Saint Benedict have been learning about the artist Sonia Boyce in Art this half term. This week, we have created a background inspired by Sonia and used pastels and water colours to create a similar design to our focussed artist. We have also been learning about mechanisms in Science and have created our own levers!



This week, in Science, Year 5 Saint Faustina have been looking at mechanisms: we focused on gears, pulleys and levers. We discussed objects that use these mechanisms and the functionality of them. We looked around the classroom to see what objects used these mechanisms. Following this, we designed our own see-saws! Well done to all of Saint Faustina on their scientific understanding!

This week in Art, Year 6 Saint Maximilian have been experimenting with printing and creating designs around our History topic of WWI. We made two different prints, the first creating a battlefield background and the second a series of poppies. We then painted our prints and overlapped them to create imagery inspired by the poppy fields.



Year 6 Saint Josephine class have been busy studying the structures of micro-organisms. We learnt that bacteria, fungi and viruses look different under the microscope and are different sizes. Did you know that if a person was the size of Europe, fungi would be the size of a football pitch? Using our new found knowledge, we recreated micro-organisms using playdough and petri dishes.

What is the School Wellbeing Service (SWS)?

The SWS is a team of mental health practitioners that support families and schools to help children and young people stay and get back to being emotionally healthy.

When might you benefit from our support?

If you have concerns about your child's emotional wellbeing or if you have noticed any of the following affecting family or school life:



Having fears or worries



Feeling sad or angry



Difficulties sharing feelings and having outbursts



Difficulties following rules and requests



Difficulties with friendships or siblings

What we offer

We offer a range of work to help, including:



GUIDED SELF-HELP (GSH) INTERVENTIONS

- In primary schools, we support parents and carers using GSH interventions based on Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) principles
- In secondary schools, we offer 1:1 sessions of GSH with YP



GROUPS, WORKSHOPS, AND ASSEMBLIES FOR PUPILS

On mental health themes such as:

- Understanding and managing emotions
- Building confidence and self-esteem



GROUP WORKSHOPS FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

- Understanding and managing your child's anxiety
- Positive parenting strategies
- Supporting your child with secondary transition



GROUP WORKSHOPS FOR STAFF

- Understanding and managing pupil's anxiety
- Staff wellbeing
- Emotional school based avoidance
