
FOSH is a voluntary organisation which is open to all parents/carers of children at our school. FOSH aims:





Throughout the Bible the joyful images of weddings are often used to describe how much God loves us. When Jesus told this story he was thinking of the Chosen People, the people of Israel, but many of their leaders did not respond to God's invitation when Jesus came.

God's invitation is not just for certain people but for all of us, regardless of our past or present situation. God's banquet starts here on earth and continues right into heaven.

You are invited to enjoy spending a short, special time with your child exploring this Sunday's Gospel and this Wednesday's word, which is **INVITATION**.

Ask your child what the word 'invitation' means to them. Then each of you tell one another about the best invitation that you've ever had. What was good about it? Have you ever refused an invitation? How does it feel when you invite someone to a party? How does it feel when someone invites you for tea, to play or to a wedding? It may help your child if you tell them about an invitation which you would most like to receive, and say why.

"Dear young friends, I invite everyone to learn to pray every day." Pope Francis

Every moment God is inviting us into a loving relationship. We accept God's invitation through loving him and all those around us. As a family, think about someone you could invite to your home for a meal or to play (when the time is right) - to make them feel especially valued and loved. This week, why not accept Pope Francis' invitation (above) to learn to pray every day - inviting God to guide you in all you do and in all you say?

Dear Lord Jesus, please help us to remember that every moment of the day you are inviting us into your love, to share in your happiness and peace. Amen.







Year 1-St Francis




Year 3—St Martin


St. Catherine




UKS2 Phase News


This week, Year 5 Saint Benedict have been exploring non-chronological reports and identifying the key features of them. We have also been busy in our new maths topic: 'Addition and Subtraction'. We have been adding and subtracting with regrouping and setting it out using a formal method.



This week, in RE, Year 5 Saint Faustina have been exploring the miraculous signs of Feeding the 5000 and comparing the story to the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Firstly, we mapped the story and identified the words, actions and symbols that Jesus used. Then we looked at the Sacrament of the Eucharist and compared the similarities with Feeding the 5000. Lastly, we drew a picture of Jesus on the shore of Lake Galilee.



This week, in Science, Year 6 Saint Maximilian class have been learning about different micro-organisms! We learnt that there were three groups: bacteria, fungi and viruses and explored how they were structurally different from one another. We then made these structures with playdough and had other pairs guess what we created based on their appearances.



Year 6 Saint Josephine class have been using a variety of mediums to create WWI poppy artwork- inspired by the artist Frank Bowling. Firstly, we painted our backgrounds and then we used glue, salt and paint to create texture to make our poppies stand out.

Information for Parents and Carers

What is the School Wellbeing Service (SWS)?

The SWS is a team of mental health practitioners that support families and schools to help children and young people stay and get back to being emotionally healthy.

When might you benefit from our support?

If you have concerns about your child's emotional wellbeing or if you have noticed any of the following affecting family or school life:



Having fears or worries



Feeling sad or angry



Difficulties sharing feelings and having outbursts



Difficulties following rules and requests



Difficulties with friendships or siblings

What we offer

We offer a range of work to help, including:



GUIDED SELF-HELP (GSH) INTERVENTIONS

- In primary schools, we support parents and carers using GSH interventions based on Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) principles
- In secondary schools, we offer 1:1 sessions of GSH with YP



GROUPS, WORKSHOPS, AND ASSEMBLIES FOR PUPILS

On mental health themes such as:

- Understanding and managing emotions
- Building confidence and self-esteem



GROUP WORKSHOPS FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

- Understanding and managing your child's anxiety
- Positive parenting strategies
- Supporting your child with secondary transition



GROUP WORKSHOPS FOR STAFF

- Understanding and managing pupil's anxiety
- Staff wellbeing
- Emotional school based avoidance

As a parent or carer, accessing support from the SWS will involve:

- Around 8 one-to-one sessions
- Help for you and your child to learn and practice new ways of managing difficulties
- Linking with your child's school and other services that could help if necessary
