# MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER, MR. LANE

Yesterday, Thursday 5th October was the Feast Day of one of the class saints, St Faustina Year 5 whose teacher is Miss Farci. The children have already learned a lot about St Faustina. She was born Maria Faustyna Kowalska in Poland on 25th August 1905 and died on 5th October 1938. She was the third of ten children; her father was a carpenter and peasant, and the family was poor and religious. As a young girl, she was very religious and often felt a calling to Jesus. At the age of 20 she joined a convent in Warsaw, the capital city of Poland. She was beatified in 1993 by Pope John Paul II and canonised a Saint on 30th April 2000, again by Pope John Paul II who was the first Polish pope.



This week you will have received some information, from the Children's Commissioner, Rachel de Souza, about a survey called 'The Big Ambition'. I'm sure you will join me in thanking everyone in FOSH for their continued hard work for the benefit of all our pupils



## Our Lady of Victory and why October is the month of the Rosary

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. The month of October is dedicated to the holy Rosary, one of the best-known of all Catholic devotions. October includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7). The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary.

The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centred on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption with each decade referring to an event in the life of Jesus and Mary. The Mysteries of the Rosary give us “thumbnails” of the life of Christ and his Mother.

**The Joyful Mysteries** are taken mostly from Saint Luke’s Gospel in the New Testament. They involve the joyful events of Jesus’ childhood.


**The Luminous Mysteries** bring a deeper understanding of the public life of Jesus. They fill in the blanks between the childhood of Jesus and His suffering and death on the cross.

**The Sorrowful Mysteries** remind us of how much Jesus loves us. They recall how He suffered and died just for us.

**The Glorious Mysteries** tell us what happened after Jesus died-Resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the love Jesus had for his Mother.

In this month of October, let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a means to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation.

Jesus said, "There was once a landowner who planted a vineyard, rented it to some tenant farmers and then went off far away. When the fruit-season came, he sent some of his servants to the farmers to collect his fruit. But the farmers seized his servants. He then sent his son to them. 'They will respect my son,' he said. **Good News for Families**

Our schools and parishes continue to share Jesus' message today, so that all people can live in a right relationship with God. Through our words and especially through our actions we too can be God's messengers, sharing God's joy and love at home, at school and in the community.

**1 Our Special Time Together** Enjoy reading the Gospel overleaf (or below for younger children)

Jesus said, "There was once a landowner who planted a vineyard, rented it to some tenant farmers and then went off far away. When the fruit-season came, he sent servants to collect the fruit which he was owed. But the farmers seized his servants. Finally, the landowner sent his son, but they treated him like the other servants so that they could have the vineyard for themselves." Then Jesus said, "When the landowner returns to the vineyard he'll remove those tenants and give the vineyard to good tenants instead."

Did the tenant farmers listen to the servants sent by the landowner? Which words stood out for you, and why? See the Gospel picture opposite. What does it make you think about?

**2 Wednesday's Word is ...**

"Let the message of Christ live in you." *St Paul*

Ask your child what the word 'messenger' means to them. Who do they think are God's messengers today? Who brings the message of Jesus to them? Which of Jesus' messages does your child like best, and which is your favourite? You may want to tell your child which messengers brought the good news about Jesus to you when you were younger (e.g. a family member, a teacher, a priest, a friend), through what they said and how they lived.

**3 Loving God & Each Other**

"How wonderful it is to proclaim to everyone the love of God which gives meaning to our lives!" *Pope Francis*

What do we think are the best ways that we can be God's messengers in these coming weeks? Perhaps we can demonstrate our faith in God through being peacemakers - showing God's love and kindness to those around us; remember to start our day with a quiet time of prayer, just listening to God in our hearts before moving into actions; talk with others about why we believe in God. Let's help God's messengers throughout the world by offering this week's Family Time prayer below for priests, missionaries and for all those who share the message of God's love.

Dear Lord Jesus, thank you for all your messengers who help us to know you. Help us to be your faithful messengers, so that others will come to know the joy of loving you. Amen.




# EYFS Phase News

## Nursery: St Anthony & St Nicholas:

This week the children have been enjoying autumn. They worked hard to sweep up leaves that had been falling in the Nursery garden and then took great delight in throwing them up in the air and watching them floating back down again.

In our RE topic, *Right at the Beginning*, the children have been learning that God created us to each be special and unique. With a partner they looked at some of the ways that showed they were different to each other and then created a piece of artwork for display which showed how we are all different shapes and sizes.



## Reception: St Peter:

Children in Reception have been experimenting with water in the sand to help them make sandcastles.

We thought about how much water we might need to make the consistency just right for the perfect sandcastle. It took us a few attempts but Aisha and Misael worked out that should have some wet and some dry sand!



## Reception: St Jude:

This week we have been reading 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. The children were inspired to make junk model rockets, just like Baby Bear! The adults were so impressed by their designs and the techniques that they used!

Sonny explained what the buttons on his rocket did: "They make the rocket blasters fire up", whilst Olivia included star buttons on her rocket "to zoom to the moon!"



# KS1 Phase News


## Year 1-St Brigid and St Francis


## Year 3– St Martin de Porres


# UKS2 Phase News

At the end of last week, Year 5 St. Benedict were investigating air resistance. We made predictions and discussed the variables we could change. They then created their own parachutes in groups. We took them outside to test which size parachute would fall to the ground the quickest. Well done for being amazing scientists year 5!



This week in Art, Year 5 Saint Faustina class have explored the emotions associated with colour. We brainstormed our own ideas and emotions associated with colours and then used a colour wheel to further our understanding. We then examined art by Sonia Boyce. Finally, we used coloured pencils to create new versions of Boyce's art so it reflected different emotions. Well done to all of Saint Faustina for your artistic understanding and hard work!

In History, Year 6 Saint Maximilian have been exploring sources of information and the use of propaganda to persuade men and women to help support the War effort. We also looked at the experiences of Commonwealth soldiers across the world and wrote diary entries as if we were stationed on the battlefields.



On Monday, Year 6 Saint Josephine took part in our weekly Gymnastics lesson. This week, we were focusing on jumps! We started the lesson recapping solo jumps and then moved onto partner jumps.
